Work Report of Commission on Geoheritage **(January,2019--- December,2019)**

Commission on Geoheritage (COG) of the International Geographical Union (IGU) is to promote the development of Geoparks from the Geographical perspectives. The objectives of the COG include:

- communicating the role of Geoparks as tools of education, recreation and nature conservation;
- further developing the concept of sustainability as applied to Geoparks;
- communicating the importance of understanding a broad range of processes that affect the sustainable development of Geoparks, including the natural environment, political, and socio-economic processes;
- communicating the results of the research by members of the Commission to various academic, industry and policy arenas in order to influence policy in an effective and appropriate manner.

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In the last five years, IGU-CoG focused on the development of comparative studies on geoheritage, tourism and corresponding social, economic, environmental and political change and concentrated on the communication and transfer of research results in policy relevant terms to policy makers and industry as well as continuing the scientific publishing programme of the Commission. The Commission seeks to continue its activities as outlined in relation to its existing objectives.

This work report will introduce the COG work in 2019 from the aspects of MEMBERSHIP, MEETINGS, NETWORK, PUBLICATION respectively.

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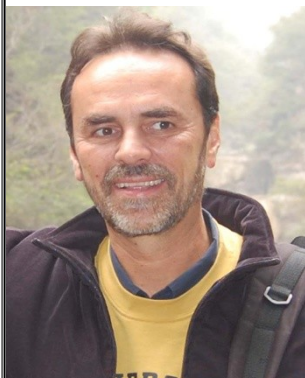
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MEETINGS

The Commission was active in and organized some major conferences in 2019

(1) XII International Geographical Union, India (IGU- India) Conference on Climate

Change, Natural Disasters and Sustainable Development

XII International Geographical Union, India (IGU- India) Conference on Climate Change, Natural Disasters and Sustainable Development was organized in Government Post Graduate College, Sector-1, Panchkula in Haryana, India during February 22-24, 2019 with the collaboration IGU Commission on Geoheritage. More than 300 abstracts were received for this conference from national and international participants. The conference had around 19 foreign participants from the country of Japan, USA, South Africa, Taiwan, Myanmar, Bangladesh, Russian Federation and Hong Kong (China). The Russian Geographical Society actively participated in the conference. Several participants from different parts of the country presented their research findings. IGU President Professor Yukio Himiyama, IGU Secretary-General and Treasurer, Professor R. B. Singh, IGU Commission on Geoheritage, executive member Dr. Subhash Anand, IGU Commission on Biogeography and Biodiversity Secretary, Dr. Pankaj Kumar participated all three days. One Special Technical Session was devoted to Geopark and Geoheritage was conducted and about nine papers received for presentation in this session. This conference was fully successful.

(2) International Symposium on National Park and Natural Heritage Protection

Conference

In order to promote the development of the national park and natural heritage domestically, the International Symposium on National Park and Natural Heritage Protection was held in Beijing on October 19 and 20, 2019. The symposium aimed to (1) carry out in-depth research on national park and natural heritage protection; (2) disseminate and share the knowledge and experience of national park and natural

heritage protection; (3) collect best practice cases; (4) promote the further improvement and implementation of protection policies; (5) build a platform for cooperation and communication between government, enterprises and research institutes in the field of national park and natural heritage protection.

The International Symposium on National Park and Natural Heritage Protection gathered global researchers in the fields of national park administration, institutional pilot and creation unit, geoheritage and many other friends. Participants shared the experience of protection and sustainable development of geoheritage and national parks, discussed strategies for protecting national park and natural heritage in new era, and provided a conservation platform for international and domestic researchers to communicate and build opportunities to cooperate with each other.

NETWORKING

The president of the IGU-COG, Dr.Wei, has built a bond cooperating relationship with Sanjiangyuan National Park and published the *Interpretive Handbook of the Sanjiangyuan National Park*.

IGU-COG cooperated with UNESCO, IUCN etc. international organizations about geoheritage programs. Eight experts from IUCN WCPA Geoheritage Specialist Group was invited to participate the International Symposium on National Park and Natural Heritage and give presentations. During the symposium, the chair of the IGU-COG, Dr.Wei, had several table meetings with the experts, and discussed how IGU-COG would cooperate with IUCN WCPA Geoheritage Specialist Group to promote the sustainable development of geoheritage. IGU-COG also builded good relationship with some national government, like China Ministry of Land and Resources and Ministry of Housing and Rural and Urban Development, China Ministry of Environment Protection etc. to promote the education and protection of the geoparks. IGU-COG also cooperated with many local governments to promote the development of geoparks, like Xiuwu county in Henan Province, Shangrao City in Jiangxi Province, Taining county in Fujian province etc.

IGU-COG continue working with Commission on Biogeography and Biodiversity, Geography Education and Land Use and Coverage Commission. IGU-CoG invited the

members of Biogeography and Biodiversity to attend XII International Geographical Union, India (IGU- India) Conference on Climate Change, Natural Disasters and Sustainable Development. IGU-CoG also worked with Commission on Geography Education and tried to find out the improved methods to integrate geography education in geoheritage sites.

PUBLICATION

The publication of the ***INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL OF GEOHERITAGE AND PARKS*** was going as planned in 2019.

The first issue of International Journal of Geoheritage was published in June, 2013. In 2018, Beijing Normal University signed the agreement with Keai Publishing House and the journal has been published by Keai since January 2019. And currently it publishes 4 issues and 20 research articles every year. In 2019, the journal achieved the publishing goals with 4 issues and 20 articles.
